I had women who were in other cities, like I said, so when I went to the Bay Area, which was like maybe once or twice a month, I'd see her another two or three of them in Chicago. And back in San Antonio, I had that core four or five women I can manage. And I did have a woman who lived like an hour away. And a woman who lived like three or four hours away closer to the Mexican border down to make Allen and another one in Brownsville, I only see them like once a month. So there was built in break time from seeing each other with those women. And that admittedly sort of allowed me to creep up the number of women I was seeing simultaneously.
